Scottish Law Commission Bills

Members will be aware that the Parliament agreed motion S4M-06693: *Implementing Scottish Law Commission reports* on 28 May 2013 and the associated Standing Orders changes were made on 5 June 2013. As a result, Scottish Law Commission Bills, as defined by Rule 9.17A.1, now fall within the remit of the Delegated Powers and Law Reform Committee under Rule 6.11 and may be referred to it as lead committee.

As well as implementing all or part of a report of the Scottish Law Commission, the definition of a Scottish Law Commission Bill includes criteria to be determined by the Presiding Officer. The Presiding Officer has determined under Rule 9.17A.1(b) that a Scottish Law Commission Bill is a Bill within the legislative competence of the Scottish Parliament—

- (a) where there is a wide degree to consensus amongst key stakeholders about the need for reform and the approach recommended;
- (b) which does not relate directly to criminal law reform;
- (c) which does not have significant financial implications;
- (d) which does not have significant European Convention on Human Rights (ECHR) implications; and
- (e) where the Scottish Government is not planning wider work in that particular subject area.

An updated version *Guidance on Public Bills* will be published in due course taking account of these changes. ***S4M-06893 Jackie Baillie: Diabetes Week**—That the Parliament notes that Diabetes Week 2013 will run from 9 to 15 June; believes that this is an opportunity to raise awareness of diabetes; notes that Diabetes UK has estimated that there has been a 25.6% increase in the number of people diagnosed in Scotland with the condition and that, since 2006, 1,900 children and young people in Scotland have been admitted to hospital with diabetic ketoacidosis, which is a life-threatening condition that requires immediate medical attention, and commends Diabetes UK on organising the Walk for Diabetes and other outdoor events throughout Scotland to raise awareness of the condition and to promote a more active lifestyle.

***S4M-06892 Jackie Baillie: Motor Neurone Disease Awareness Month**—That the Parliament welcomes Motor Neurone Disease (MND) Awareness Month, which takes place in June; recognises that MND is a progressive, life-limiting disease that can affect any adult at any time and that the disease attacks the nerves that control movement, leaving them unable to move, walk, talk and ultimately breathe; understands that five people die every day in the UK from MND and around half of those diagnosed die within 14 months; further understands that there is no diagnostic test, no effective treatment and no cure; commends organisations such as MND Scotland for their part in raising awareness of this disease, and looks forward to events such as the Stovie Dance on 15 June 2013 in the Thainstone Exchange and the Men's Health Forum Scotland's 10K run in Glasgow on Father's Day.

Subsequently, the member may lodge a final proposal, in broadly similar terms to the draft, accompanied by a summary of consultation responses (or the statement of reasons). The member secures the right to introduce a Bill to give effect to the proposal if the final proposal secures, within one month, the support of at least 18 other members from at least half the political parties or groups represented in the Parliamentary Bureau, and provided no indication is given that the Scottish Government or UK Government is planning equivalent legislation.
